
Homehunt Review

The IGHT rental housing policy, Homehunt Gigha, has been reviewed by the Housing Allocation Group and the IGHT Board of Directors. Full details of adjustments will be issued to members for review and comments.

Renewables

GREL had a successful blade inspection on the Dancing Ladies that took place with the use of a drone. For the age of the turbines (30 years+), they are still in very reasonable condition.

The gearbox replacement for T2 had been scheduled for mid-June, but unfortunately the original climbing system that is fitted to all three V27 turbines is corroded and is now beyond a safe condition. The proposed solution is to supply self-retracting fall arrest inertia blocks (pictured) and the appropriate accessories and to mount it above the ladder. These devices will allow for safe traversal up and down the turbine and can also act as a rescue device from the ladder, as it has a lever to operate from the block that can be used to raise or lower a casualty.
